I noticed quite a few of our members travelled to the ABS auction held at Beenleigh. Some had birds for sale and did quite well. Great to see breeders from other areas recognizing the quality of birds being bred within our club area. There were also quite a few new stock birds purchased, which hopefully will improve the standard of the birds in those members aviaries.

Our Annual Show is fast approaching and now is the time to select your show teams and start preparing. (Show schedule is in this edition.) Then after our show it is then not long until our Young Bird Selection Show, Zone Selection and the National Show. Speaking of the Nationals, those intending to go need to get their registrations in ASAP as I believe they close in March, same with accommodation. Full details on the ANBC web-site.

With our first meeting of the year on the Sixth of February I would urge members attending these meetings to bring along some birds for our table shows. These shows have dropped off greatly in numbers the last couple of years. These table shows, especially for beginner breeders, are one of the best ways of learning about our birds. Learn what judges are looking for as well as the different varieties and just join in the general banter about birds. After all the Budgie is what our hobby is all about. Table shows are one of the best show training methods you can get, it gets the birds used to the cage, being looked at and moved by strangers up close, as well as strange noises and lights. The travelling to the meeting helps settle them as well.

At the February meeting the feature talk will be on crop feeding, I will be doing a demonstration and giving some tips. If anyone is interested you can bring along a bird to have a practice on. If you already have a crop needle and syringe, please bring them along. Crop feeding is a very useful skill to have in the birdroom. If you are not confident in crop feeding come along and we may be able to help you.

# What Is Responsible Bird Breeding?

Is it just genetics, conformation charts, and pedigrees that go back to the nineteenth century?

Or is it the long game--- the buying, raising, training, showing and placing birds into lives where they won't end up as a cautionary tale on a rescue page?

Being a breeder covers, the pairing up, the raising of chicks, training, showing, nutrition, buying strategies, marketing and ethics. Some might say that's "off-topic" I'd say that's responsible breeding.

You can't raise good birds in a vacuum. You need to understand markets, training realities, and what a "forever home" actually looks like. (Spoiler: there is no such thing.)

## ***Breeding is a system, not a snapshot.***

Anyone can put a cockbird to a hen.

What separates a breeder from a hobbyist is what happens after.

Are you breeding for good health, confirmation and temperament that you've seen in the winning birds?

Do you understand what buyers at sales are actually paying for?

Are your birds being taught calmness, confidence, and show steadiness from hatching, or do you hand them off like parcels and hope for the best?

**Showing:-** Not for ribbons, but for reputation. If a bird of your breeding can't prove itself in public, why would someone know about and want to try your stock?

**Health and Appearance:-** Your birds need to be complete of feather, clean and active. This applies to your bird room, flights and equipment also. Again, reputation influences people in wanting your stock.

**Training:-** Because a sound healthy bird with no training is much harder to sell in todays cautious market. How would you know it is sound unless it perches correctly and calmly displays itself?

**Buying:-** Because if you can't evaluate stock wisely, you'll never refine your stock or buy the right birds to improve your programme, or understand a buyer's needs.

## ***A broader lens builds better breeders.***

If you want to breed well, you need to live wide.


Not just in aviaries and breeding rooms, but in sale and auction sheds and around the kitchen table where buyers or fellow breeders tell you what they really want.

I write about those things because they're the context. This isn't an article about breeding mechanics. It's a space for thinking breeders.

People who care about the long haul. People who want their birds to thrive in today's world, not just make it into it.

# **True Grit – The unseen miles.**

Where true breeders, like true runners, find their strength. Running has its roads. We have our flights, birdsrooms and nest checks. Runners face the wall at mile twenty. We face it when that super bird dies, when the seed is scarce and expensive or when a years worth of breeding plans fall apart.

Just as the runner keeps moving when their lungs are burning, we keep showing up when the plan unravels. Grit is not a medal. It is cleaning out flights, breeding cages and birdroom every day. It is a quite decision to keep walking towards the aviary when every muscle says stop.

Every breeder knows the easy part is dreaming. The hard part is keeping faith when nature reminds you who is really in charge. Grit is not talent. It is not luck. It is the thing that kicks in when both of those have left the aviary.

Just as the runner trains in the dark long before the race, the bird breeder works in silence long before the results appear. You see grit in the hen that lost her chick but still feeds and cares for the remaining chicks. You see it in the breeder who works a promising youngster into a show winner. You see it in youreself when you put down the disappointment and pick up the show cage again.

There are no medals for the heartbreaks we survive. No applause for the times we wait through a disease outbreak or the plans that never make it past the breeding room. But grit lives there, in the unseen hours holding onto hope when everything shakes.

Just as the runner finds strength in the rhythm of their breath, we find it in the rhythm of the birds in flight, the soft chatter of the birds in the flights and the steady sounds of the chicks in the nests. Those rhythms remind us that progress is built on persistence not perfection.

The truth? The finish line never comes. It is not the ribbon at the show, not the sale of a bird, not even the perfect bird. It is merely a checkpoint. A reminder to keep refining, to stay humble, to keep learning.

Because breeding like running, is not about winning. It is about becoming unbreakable.

So the next time things fall apart, and they will, remember this. Grit is not about pushing harder. It is about staying true, steady and kind under pressure.

Now take a breath. Walk down to the aviary. Look at your birds. They already know.

Then start again.




